

Blue Coat Junior School Sports Premium 2023-2024

Our Sports Premium allowance for the academic year 2023-2024 is **£18300**. The premium will be used to fund additional and sustainable improvements to the provision of PE and sport to encourage the development of healthy, active lifestyles. The Department for Education's vision for the Primary PE and Sports Premium is that ALL pupils leaving primary school should be physically literate and with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy, active lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport. We endeavour to see an improvement against the following 5 key indicators:

OPAL allows the children to develop their physical literacy in a safe and fun environment whilst also developing communication skills and resilience. The leaders applied what they had learned by delivering games at break and lunchtime. They are now leading games/activities for children every day , thereby promoting regular engagement of pupils in physical activity. These leaders regularly meet with the PE to discuss the games they are delivering at playtimes and adapt to suggestions from pupil voice. - Following an audit of staff confidence, it was identified the gymnastics was an area that CPD would be beneficial. The PE teacher was able to observe the coach and identify elements of good practice which can then be embedded in their own practice. 64 children benefited directly from these sessions, but due to the increased subject knowledge and confidence of the staff member, the impact will be across the school • Analysis as PE assessment data highlighted that SEND pupils were not making as much progress as other pupils. Therefore, an intervention was put in place so that SEND pupils would receive an additional PE session each week which would focus on early movement skills. This was supported by a specialist sports coach. 10 children took part in these sessions and the data following on from this shows that they have made more progress than previously. • 14 children participated in a swimming gala, this gave them the opportunity to take part in competitive sport against other schools. • Durham City Primary Schools FA programme - 30 children have taken part in football competitions/ leagues. This has been a great opportunity to take part in competitive sport • Tri-golf events was attended by all of our year 3 and 4 pupils which gave them the opportunity to try a new sport • 24 year 6 pupils have supported the delivery of SSP festivals. They have had some leadership training before delivering activities at the festivals. This has promoted their self confidence, leadership skills and oracy. • During sports week, the children have been given the opportunity to try a wide variety of sports which they may not have done before.

Y	Y		Y		£2610	- During sports week, a variety of coaches/instructors delivered sessions to the pupils with a wide variety of sports covered - many of which were new to the pupils. These included climbing, netball, football, badminton, skipping, athletics and dance. The week promoted physical activity amongst all pupils and allowed us to emphasise the 60 mins of physical activity per day recommendation. It also gave the children a breadth of different sports and promoted links to local clubs - Some of the sessions also acted as CPD for staff which will allow us to deliver high quality lessons across the curriculum - some of the activities were specifically chosen so that the children have more ideas of how to stay physically active during play times e.g. skipping, netball games and we have already seen the children implement these themselves
