

Blue Coat Junior School Sports Premium 2022-2023

Our Sports Premium allowance for the academic year 2022-2023 is £18300 The premium will be used to fund additional and sustainable improvements to the provision of PE and sport to encourage the development of healthy, active lifestyles. The Department for Education's vision for the Primary PE and Sports Premium is that ALL pupils leaving primary school should be physically literate and with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy, active lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport. We endeavour to see an improvement against the following 5 key indicators:

OPAL (Outdoor Play and Learning) This was originally introduced prior to Covid but has been on hold until this academic year. OPAL allows the children to develop their physical literacy in a safe and fun environment whilst also developing communication skills and resilience. TLR As the profile of sport and physical activity is a priority across the school, a TLR is in place to support the strategic development of PE and school sport. This means that dedicated time and expertise can be utilised to increase physical activity particularly as we are aware that there will need to be a focus on physical activity and well-being following the impact of school closures and the restrictions associated with Covid.	Y	Y	Y	Y	Y	£2111	- This has allowed the PE lead to support the members of staff delivering PE through both the planning and delivery of lessons - CPD has been shared with those teaching PE - A new PE curriculum was designed for this year which followed on from an audit of the children's experience and skills (which has been affected by Covid). This meant that the children were receiving a curriculum which was tailored specifically to allow them to make the ebay progress possible - A new PE scheme has been embedded over the course of the year

The leaders applied what they had learned by delivering games at break and lunchtime. They are now leading games/activities for children every day, thereby promoting regular engagement of pupils in physical activity. These leaders regularly meet with the PE to discuss the games they are delivering at playtimes and adapt to suggestions from pupil voice.

• School Games Mark Intra-School Competition - This programme is to help schools provide leadership and in-school competition opportunities. It will consist of 1 full day which will include a session training year 6 Sports Leaders and 4 half-days of SSP support. • Summer Fun Run - led by SSP staff, a fun and relaxed way to engage all children in physical activity and promote a healthy lifestyle • Ultimate Frisbee Day - delivered to a range of classes to provide a broad range of activities to the children • Quidditch Day - delivered to a range of classes to provide a broad range of activities to the children • A Zumba kids morning • Access to swimming gala • Attendance at a Team Building festival • Attendance at a mini-tennis festival							• School Games Mark Leader Training and Intra-School Competition – used the morning to train 12 leaders and go through the programme, this developed their leadership and communication skills. They have since supported in the delivery of afternoon sessions focussed on multi-skills, dodgeball, and indoor athletics. All pupils across the school have participated in at least one of these events meaning that all pupils have had the opportunity to take part in an activity they might not previously have been exposed to and school sport has been promoted across the whole school • Gymnastics curriculum support from a PE specialist – following an audit of the PE curriculum over the Covid period it was identified that Year 5 have not had any Gymnastics for 2 years therefore a specialist was brought in so as to provide CPD for staff and deliver high quality lessons with the aim of addressing skills gaps. They recapped a lot of key skills – balance, travel, partner matching/mirroring/ jumps. They worked on different formations with a partner such as face to face, back to back, side by side. 64 pupils took part in this and have developed their gymnastic skills. • 14 children participated in a swimming gala, this gave them the opportunity to take part in competitive sport against other schools. • Durham City Primary Schools FA programme - 30 children have taken part in football competitions/ leagues. This has been a great opportunity to take part in competitive sport • Team Building festival - 22 children took part in a festival which promote their physical literacy and communication skills

The week promoted physical activity amongst all pupils and allowed us to emphasise the 60 mins of physical activity per day recommendation. It also gave the children a breadth of different sports and promoted links to local clubs, some pupils have since contacted some of the clubs to look at taking up the sport out of school. Some of the sessions also acted as CPD for staff which will allow us to deliver high quality lessons across the curriculum
